THE WELL ARMED WOMAN—ONTARIO, NY

When I first decided to become a firearms instructor, I didn't know where the path would lead. It began as a personal goal to heal. I was recovering from a debilitating shoulder injury that left me with a 50% loss of use of my right shoulder, arm and hand. Toward the end of the 18 months of post-surgical physical therapy I set a goal for myself. I enrolled in the training course offered by the NRA and The Well Armed Woman. I had four months from the enroll date to get myself in good enough shape to pass the course. I told my husband, John, "I'm going to be a firearms instructor." And we began training.

The first time on the range was interesting. John handed me the his favorite G19, and with his patient instruction I was able to get my right arm up long enough to fire a few shots. Each visit to the range resulted in a few more well-placed shots, a stronger arm and a developing confidence. By the time of the training, we built up to a substantial hour of practice with the G19 and with his STI single stack 40 caliber 1911 that eventually became my favorite firearm and my first competition gun.

I completed the training, passed the qualifier with five hits into a three-inch circle, and remembered how much I enjoyed teaching, collecting certifications and having a purpose. I went on to at least a half-dozen more firearm related teaching certifications. That's how I came to be a TWAW Certified Instructor.

This year, all certified TWAW chapter leader instructors were required to demonstrate a standard competency. In addition to a written test, we were required to submit a series of videos of ourselves teaching various components of the TWAW curriculum, and one video demonstrating our shooting skill. It was quite a bit of work, but I scored a 100%. The moral of the story: follow your path and don't give up.

REMINDERS

Range Security Access is limited to members and their guests.

Your FOB records your IN AND OUT. Close the gate each time you pass. Do not allow anyone else to enter without using their own FOB. There is a fee for lost FOBs.

Please **SIGN IN every guest** in the log located in the box on the high-power range. Two (2) guests per member at a time, and no more than 3 times per year. Get them to join.

Wear your ID or have it visible to identify yourself as a member. Get to know who is using the facility.

Anyone deliberately destroying or damaging anything on the range, shoot houses, clubhouse or grounds, including wildlife, will be subject to immediate removal and will face the consequences of such actions in accordance with our ORGC Bylaws and Constitution.

Use of equipment provided in Eagles Range is a privilege of membership. It is expected that all people who use the range will leave the range in good condition for the next user.

The shooting season is about to start, are you ready?

As I write this article, it appears that global warming has not quite caught up to us in upstate New York yet. The snow is falling, the ski season is in full swing and the Canadian geese are still on their journey in the south enjoying the warm temperatures. Nevertheless, the ORGC board and the pistol, rifle and 3 gun competition coordinators have been working steadily to organize the match schedule for the 2019 season.
