#### A MEMORABLE EVENT-PROJECT APPLESEED

On October 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>, I had the pleasure of attending 'Project Appleseed'. Project Appleseed is a nonprofit National organization that teaches rifle marksmanship skills which were once common practice in America. It also provides history on how the United States of America was formed. History of the beginning of the Revolutionary war is shared by the instructors during breaks from shooting. Most of the history is regarding the events that took place on April 19, 1775. I love history and shooting my .22 rifle for me, Project Appleseed seemed like a perfect weekend. I was not disappointed!

There were 25 shooters at this two-day event. 5 of the 25 shooters were members of ORGC. The other 20 shooters came from many different areas including Buffalo, Syracuse, Ithaca, Utica and Saratoga Springs, just to name a few. There were 3 teenagers, and the rest were adults. Some shooters had attended a Project Appleseed program prior and couldn't wait to attend another one. I was one of about 10 of us who had never taken the class before. I almost forgot to mention, 4 of the 25 shooters were women!

I have shot my .22 rifle at other clubs and attended other competitive events. This truly was one of the safest run events. The instructors (Range officers) were incredibly detail oriented and kept the firing line safe 100% of the time.

On the second day of shooting, it was a colder overcast day with some light rain from time to time. The energy on the range was contagious. Shooters were excited and encouraged in the amount of improvement that had taken place from the first day. You never would have known it was an overcast day!

The weekend ended with 'Apple Qualification Test', better known as AQT's. Targets are placed at 35 yards and shooting is done from the standing, sitting and prone position with specific amounts of ammunition and timed. If you score over 210 points, you are granted a 'rifleman patch'.

Friendships were made. Laughter was shared and a promise to return to ORGC for another Project Appleseed were mentioned time after time.

Mark your calendars! Project Appleseed is hoping to return to ORGC on Sept. 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022. You'll need a .22 rifle, approximately 400 rounds of ammunition, and an open mind willing to break bad habits and learn new ones! Join me for one of the best experiences on the range.

#### **VOLUNTEERS—BY DAVE JENKINS**

"There are gun clubs out there that need your help. Will you be one of the members that answers that call? Are you willing to help make your club viable for the next generation of shooter?

Being a member at a lot of gun clubs and serving on a board of a few has taught me a few things.

If you are a member of a club and you:

- 1. Have never been to a meeting
- 2. Have not volunteered for something
- 3. Only visit, shoot, and leave
- 4. Don't know who does volunteer there
- 5. Looks at other sports at the club as a negative
- 6. Do not get involved

Then do you truly wish to see your club prosper? Or are you just a user who feels paying dues is enough? Guess what? It is very easy to change all of that and help YOUR club at the same time.

Most clubs are guided by the older generation because they know what needs to be done to keep clubs open for the rest of the membership.

A big issue is that they are getting older and the younger generations of shooter are not getting involved. My thoughts as to why:

The younger shooter sees the older crowd "running things" and sees that crowd as "Fudds" because of the difference in ages, mindset, and sport involvement. Al lot of times the bridge between the various differences is never made due to ideas of "how this should be done" vs how it NEEDS to be done.

There are quite a few people running clubs that volunteer and dedicate A LOT of their own time, energy, and in some cases, donations, to support their club. Great things get done by those volunteers.

Another issue is that society, technology, and the shooter have all evolved and the new shooter, member, or volunteers needs to be reached and encouraged differently if we are going to get them involved.

My perspective feels that the overall image of a club needs to modernized and altered to be approachable, welcoming, and accepting of ALL those who wish to join. It should not be difficult to become a member. Yes, there should be a procedure to join, attend a safety orientation, and become a member, but it should not be overly difficult. People's schedules have changed drastically over the past 10 to 15 years. Even more so within the last 18 months!

Just like any divided topic we have, the two different sides are really one large group with similar needs (to have a place to enjoy, practice, educate, and be welcomed) but we have different approaches and ways that we want to do this.

My challenge to all of us that visit gun clubs to shoot:

Bridge the gap. Get involved. Be part of the club, not just a user but a valuable resource.

Don't complain, avoid, or belittle the younger generation OR the older generation. Find a way to accept both ideas, all sports, and make your club better.

Volunteer by helping. All it takes is a few hours a year.. There are not many new gun clubs opening up. These clubs need YOUR help and energy to stay open and be around for your kids and theirs. You can ensure that happens by getting involved and bringing new ideas and input as well.

Your club needs you. Let's see what we can do to make it happen."

#### The Trainer's Corner

"Why should I train with a professional Instructor?"

I refer to myself as a lifelong student. Why do I say that? It's because I believe one should never stop learning. Education is important.
